New this semester, MCEE is offering an online professional development training opportunity on Tuesday, October 10. To accommodate schedules, two options are offered at 12 pm or 4 pm. Teachers will receive the training zoom links following their registration at stockmarketgame.org.Trading begins Monday, October 16.

The training will feature Tim Ranzetta, the founder of Next Gen Personal Finance (NGPF), to share resources on teaching investing. Tim's saving habits started at seven when a neighbor with a broken hip gave him a dog walking job. Her recovery, which took almost a year, resulted in Tim getting to know the bank tellers quite well (and accumulating a savings account balance of over \$300). His recent entrepreneurial adventures have included driving a shredding truck, analyzing executive compensation packages for Fortune 500 companies, and helping families make better college financing decisions. After volunteering in 2010 to create and teach a personal finance program at Eastside College Prep in East Palo Alto, Tim saw firsthand the impact of an engaging and activity-based curriculum, which inspired him to start a new non-profit, Next Gen Personal Finance.

The training will also provide resources for a successful Stock Market Game experience with teacher tips and strategies as well as updates on Econ/Personal Finance graduation requirements.

With a partnership with Visa and CEE, a **\$50 Visa Gift Card** will be offered to participating teachers for the one hour course. MCEE will also provide a OPI professional development one-hour credit certificate.

## The 2023 Payback Challenge—Over \$70,000 in Scholarships for Students Available

<u>Next Gen Personal Finance</u> (NGPF) is excited to announce the <u>2022 Payback Challenge</u> with \$70,000 of scholarship funding for high school students.

The <u>Payback Challenge</u> is NGPF's annual scholarship contest that gives students a chance to win a \$2500 Grand Prize for their educational pursuits while developing an understanding of what college life will be like. More than \$50,000 in scholarships is available.

The challenge is based on NGPF's Arcade Game, <u>Payback</u>, which allows students to simulate financial decisions to get to and through college. Afterward, they respond to the question: What did you learn from the game that you'll be able to apply to your future experiences?

How to Enter

- 1. Have your students play Payback in class or at home
- 2. Students write a 250-word essay OR create a 90-second video
- 3. Collect your students' responses and nominate ONE student entry for the Payback Challenge Scholarship.

Submissions are open now. Nominations are due October 16, 2023.

Student can win over \$50,000 in scholarships. Scholarship winners will be announced in December 2023.

The following prizes will be awarded:

- --National Grand Prize: 2 winners at \$2,500 each. All entries are eligible.
- --Honorable Mention: 30 winners at \$1,000 each. Remaining entries are eligible.
- --NGPF Grant Districts: 10 winners at \$1,000 each (1 per district).

Note: NGPF must receive at least 10 submissions from one of the grant districts listed before students from that district are eligible for this prize.

## **Fun Facts & Trivia**

Biscayne National Park is located in Southeastern Florida Coast in Dade County.

Biscayne National Park has the simple beauty of a child's drawing with clear blue water, bright yellow sun, big sky. dark green woodlands, and here and there a boat, a bird.

It is a subtropical place where mainland mangrove shoreline, a warm shallow bay, many small islands, or keys, and living coral reefs intermingle.

Together they comprise a vast, almost pristine wilderness and recreation area along the southeast edge of the Florida peninsula.

The park, located just 21 miles east of Everglades National Park, was established as a national monument in 1968.

In 1980 it was enlarged to 181,500 acres and designated as a national park to protect a rare combination of terrestrial and undersea life, to preserve a scenic subtropical setting, and to provide an outstanding spot for recreation and relaxation.

Biscayne National Park's mangrove shoreline, crystal clear waters, emerald isles, and living coral reefs attract near 500,000 visitors a year.

On Florida's southern Atlantic coast, 95% of Biscayne National Park is under water, so most of the activities in this national park are water activities: boating, canoeing, diving, fishing, sailing, snorkeling, swimming, water skiing and camping.

Biscayne Bay contains about 45 low islands, called "keys," and about 20 miles of mainland mangrove shoreline.

The underwater Maritime Heritage Trail links dive sites, most of them shipwrecks.

On Boca Chita Key, Boca Chita Lighthouse has coastal views.

A museum at Convoy Point explains local ecosystems.

The earliest known residents of what is now the Biscayne National Park were the Tequesta Indians.

They lived by fishing and hunting for sea turtles, sharks, sailfish, stingrays, and sea mammals.

The manatee, presently an endangered species, was hunted for food as was the porpoise.

Non marine animals hunted were deer and freshwater turtles.

The Tequesta also gathered native plants, such as prickly pear, sea grapes, and coco plum.

When the Spaniard explorers arrived, the Tequestas were using pottery, dugout canoes, and hunting with bows and arrows.

Marine shells were used as tools, decorations, and trade items.

Biscayne was the headquarters for the notorious Pirate Black Caesar.

He was a powerful African pirate who roamed the Caribbean in the early 18th century.

Caesar is supposed to have buried around \$6 million worth of gold in the sandy shores, none of which has ever been recovered.
