Fun Facts & Trivia

Carlsbad Caverns National Park is the only national park in New Mexico and is in the southeastern corner of New Mexico in Eddy County.

Carlsbad Caverns National Park was first designated a National Monument on October 25, 1929.

It was redesignated a National Park on May 14, 1930.

Carlsbad Caverns was also designated a World Heritage Site on December 6, 1995.

This park was established to preserve Carlsbad Cavern and numerous other caves within a Permianage fossil reef.

At present there are 117 known caves in the park, and more will be discovered; the cave known as Carlsbad Cavern is only one of these.

The park contains the nation's second deepest and fourth-longest limestone cave— Lechuguilla Cave.

Lechuguilla Cave stretches more than 140 miles with a depth of 1600 feet.

Lechuguilla Cave, made famous on the *Planet Earth* series, is located in Carlsbad Caverns National Park.

Lechuguilla Cave cannot be accessed by the public and entry is allowed only for special research purposes.

Carlsbad Cavern, with one of the world's largest underground chambers and countless formations, is also highly accessible, with a variety of tours offered year-round.

The Big Room in Carlsbad Caverns, at 8.2 acres, is the largest accessible cave chamber in North America.

One of the main attractions of Carlsbad Caverns National Park is its network of underground caves and caverns, which are home to a variety of geological formations such as stalactites, stalagmites, and helictites.

The park is also home to a number of hiking trails, offering the opportunity to explore the park's unique and varied terrain.

In addition to its natural beauty, Carlsbad Caverns National Park is also home to a number of cultural and historical sites, including the historic Rattlesnake Springs and the visitor center, which offers exhibits and programs about the park's natural and cultural history.

The caves in Carlsbad Caverns are 56°F throughout the year, with high humidity.

Although Carlsbad Caverns is rightly known for its famous caves, there are also more than 50 miles of aboveground trails that explore the desert landscape.

The land that forms Carlsbad Caverns was once part of an ancient underwater reef called Capitan Reef.

The caverns were forged by sulfuric acid, not water erosion, as is the case with most limestone caves.

From details gathered from pictographs in the area, Native Americans lived in the area starting from 12-14,000 years ago.

In 1959, Carlsbad Caverns served as a location for the movie *Journey to the Center of the Earth*, with filming taking place in the King's Palace and the Boneyard.
